- Parliamentary zone—to approve the proposal by the Department of Parliamentary Services to extend the approval for temporary vehicle barriers around Parliament House—moved by the Parliamentary Secretary to the Minister for Agriculture, Fisheries and Forestry. Senator Bartlett also made <u>a statement</u> about the motion.
