

Senate Daily Summary

Tuesday 9 August 2005

The Senate met from 12.30pm until 7.58pm

New senators sworn in

Certificates of election for <u>senators elected</u> on 9 October 2004 to serve in the Senate from 1 July 2005 were tabled. The senators made and subscribed the oath or affirmation of allegiance.

Election of officers

Senators <u>Calvert</u> (Lib., Tas.) and <u>Nettle</u> (AG, NSW) were both proposed to take the office of President of the Senate. Senator Calvert was declared elected after a <u>ballot was held</u> (Senator Calvert 67, and Senator Nettle 7 votes).

Senators <u>Hogg</u> (ALP, Qld) and <u>Milne</u> (AG, Tas.) were both proposed to take the office of Deputy President of the Senate and Chair of Committees. Senator Hogg was declared elected after a <u>ballot was held</u> (Senator Hogg 70, and Senator Milne 4 votes).

Ministry and ministerial arrangements

The Leader of the Government in the Senate advised the Senate of changes to the Howard Ministry and <u>ministerial arrangements</u> in the Senate.

Other party arrangements

The Leaders in the Senate of the <u>Opposition</u>, <u>The Nationals</u>, <u>Australian</u> <u>Democrats</u>, <u>Australian Greens</u>, and the <u>Family First Party</u> advised the Senate of various party appointments
