The Minister for Immigration and Multicultural and Indigenous Affairs tabled the particulars of proposed additional expenditure for 2004-05 [the amounts contained in the appropriation bills]. The Senate agreed to a motion moved by the Minister to refer the particulars, the final budget outcome 2003-04 and the Issues from the Advance to the Finance Minister to legislation committees for examination and report.
