# **Budget 2005-06**

The Minister for Finance and Administration tabled the <u>Budget documents</u> for the year 2005-06 and associated budget papers and ministerial statements. The Opposition, minor parties and independent senators will make their responses to the Budget statement on Thursday 12 May 2005.

The Senate agreed to <u>a motion</u> by the Minister for Finance and Administration to refer documents to legislation committees to enable the committees to examine the proposed budget. This initiates the estimates hearings process. Portfolio budget statements and portfolio supplementary additional estimates statements for <u>parliamentary</u> and <u>executive</u> departments were also tabled.

# **Privilege**

The President made <u>a statement</u> relating to a matter of privilege raised by the Leader of the Opposition in the Senate (Senator Evans) concerning the failure of Senator Lightfoot to provide a statement to the Registrar of Senators' Interests concerning sponsorship of a trip to Iraq in July 2004. Senator Evans gave <u>a notice of motion</u> to refer the matter to the Committee of Privileges.
