

Senate Daily Summary

Wednesday 11 May 2005

The Senate met from 9.30am until 7.55pm

Privilege [and declaration of interest by a senator]

Senator Lightfoot made <u>a statement</u> relating to sponsorship of his visit to Iraq in July 2004 and his failure to register that interest with the Registrar of Senators' Interests. The Leader of the Opposition in the Senate (Senator Evans) withdrew his notice of motion [the notice was given on <u>10 May</u> <u>2005</u>] to refer the matter to the Committee of Privileges. The Senate debated and agreed to <u>a motion</u> moved by Senator Evans to take note of Senator Lightfoot's statement [link to <u>first speaker</u>].
