<u>The Senate ordered</u> the Minister for Environment and Heritage to table all correspondence between the Minister and the Assistant Treasurer, the Australian Taxation Office, or the Institute of Public Affairs in 2004 and 2005 relating to the issue of deductible gift recipient status of environment groups—no later than 3.30pm on 22 June 2005—moved by Senator Brown

#### Documents tabled and statement by Minister

The Special Minister of State <u>tabled</u> further submissions received by the Department of Employment and Workplace Relations in response to the Building on Success Community Development Employment Project Discussion Paper 2005 [The documents were tabled in response to the order of the Senate agreed to on <u>11 May 2005</u> on the motion of Senator Carr. Submissions were also tabled on <u>14 June 2005</u>.]. The Special Minister of State made a statement <u>indicating</u> that four submissions would not be tabled.

#### Statement by Minister
