Senator Murray gave a notice of intention to withdraw a notice to disallow Schedule 1 of the Parliamentary Entitlements Amendment Regulations 2006 (No. 1), as contained in Select Legislative Instrument 2006 No. 211 and made under the *Parliamentary Entitlements Act 1990*.

Senators Murray and Evans added their names to a notice of motion given by Senator Bob Brown to disallow Schedules 1 and 3 of the same regulations. That motion is listed for consideration on 5 September 2006.
