Motion to disallow

The Senate continued to debate a motion to disallow Schedules 1 and 3 to the Parliamentary Entitlements Amendment Regulations 2006 (No. 1), as contained in Select Legislative Instrument 2006 No. 211 and made under the *Parliamentary Entitlements Act 1990*. [first speaker]

Notice of intention to withdraw a notice

The Chair of the Standing Committee on Regulations and Ordinances gave notice of his intention to withdraw a <u>notice</u> to disallow migration regulations relating to visa applications.

New inquiry

The Senate referred the matter of <u>workforce challenges</u> in the Australian transport sector to the Employment, Workplace Relations and Education References Committee for inquiry and report by the last sitting day in June 2007.

Reporting date extended

The Senate agreed to extend the reporting date for the Legal and Constitutional Legislation Committee's examination of annual reports of government departments and agencies to 7 September 2006.

Notice of motion

A notice of motion was given to schedule supplementary Budget <u>estimates hearings</u> from 30 October to 2 November 2006

Question on notice-failure to provide an answer

<u>Senator Allison asked</u> the Minister representing the Minister for Human Services for an explanation of an answer not being provided to a question on notice relating to a proposed access card for health and welfare services. <u>The Minister</u> provided the answer.

The Senate debated a matter of public importance about Telstra shareholders proposed by Senator Conroy. [first speaker]

Motion defeated

The Senate *did not agree* to a <u>motion</u> moved by Senator Ray requiring the tabling of documents held by Telstra Corporation relating to shareholder attitude surveys.
