The Senate met from 9.30am until 11.00pm

The Minister for Justice and Customs tabled <u>the particulars</u> of proposed additional expenditure for 2005-06 [the amounts contained in the appropriation bills] and statement of savings. The Senate agreed to <u>a</u> <u>motion</u> moved by the Minister to refer the particulars, the final budget outcome 2004-05 and the Issues from the Advance to the Finance Minister to legislation committees for examination and report. The Minister for Justice and Customs <u>tabled</u> data submitted to Food Standards Australia New Zealand for all applications for genetically-modified foods. [The documents were tabled in response to the order of the Senate agreed to on <u>7 February 2006</u> on the motion of Senator Stott Despoja.] The Minister made <u>a statement</u> indicating that further documents would be tabled when they became available.

Motion defeated

The Senate *did not agree* to <u>a motion</u> by Senator Stott Despoja for the tabling of data relating to the sheep study conducted by the Commonwealth Scientific and Industrial Research Organisation on the effect of transgenic peas on the immune response of sheep
