Legislation

The following bills were introduced in the Senate

- □ Agriculture, Fisheries and Forestry Legislation Amendment (Export Control and Quarantine) Bill 2006 [passed by the House of Representatives on 10 August 2006]
- □ Migration Legislation Amendment (Provisions Relating to Character and Conduct) Bill 2006 [Private senator's bill]
- □ Therapeutic Goods Amendment Bill (No. 3) 2006 [passed by the House of Representatives on 10 August 2006]

Bill withdrawn

The Minister for Justice and Customs advised the Senate that the Government would not be proceeding with the Migration Amendment (Designated Unauthorised Arrivals) Bill 2006. No action was taken on the message from the House of Representatives sending the bill to the Senate.

The following bill was considered

- □ Aboriginal Land Rights (Northern Territory) Amendment Bill 2006
 - a motion to divide the bill into two separate bills was defeated
 - committee of the whole commenced–2 Government <u>requests for amendments</u> agreed to, <u>1 section and 1 item</u> negatived,
 13 Government <u>amendments</u> to be determined

Restructuring the committee system

The Senate considered the first report of 2006 of the Procedure Committee, Restructuring the committee system [tabled on 10 August 2006]. The Senate agreed to a motion to change standing orders to restructure the committee system and adopted a temporary order relating to the membership of committees.
