### Notices of motion to disallow given

The Chair of the Standing Committee on Regulations and Ordinances gave <u>notices</u> to disallow the following delegated legislation:

- □ <u>regulations</u> to amend the A New Tax System (Commonwealth-State Financial Arrangements) Regulations 2003 by extending the years for transitional GST assistance to 30 June 2009
- Code of Practice providing practical guidance relating to the identification, assessment and control of risks arising from manual handling activity in a maritime environment
- <u>instrument</u> revoking the Approved Form for Application for Initial Approval as a Rehabilitation Program Provider and providing the approved form for the purposes of persons applying as a rehabilitation program provider
- □ <u>instrument</u> providing the approved form for persons applying for renewal of approval as a rehabilitation program provider
- determination amending schedule 4 of determination HIB 20/2006 (made under the *National Health Act 1953*) to correct an administrative oversight in the making of the determination
- instrument prohibiting foreign exchange transactions in Australia, or involving Australian residents outside of Australia, that are in some way related to certain persons associated with the Democratic People's Republic of Korea
- specification prescribing courses that an applicant seeking to be registered as a migration agent must have completed in order to be registered
- determination providing guidelines for the exercise of the power to give public interest certificates for the purposes of paragraph 208(1)(a) of the Social Security (Administration) Act 1999 by the Secretary of the Department of Employment and Workplace Relations
- □ <u>instrument</u> varying section 34D of the Safety, Rehabilitation and Compensation Act 1988 to provide the criteria for approval or renewal of approval of rehabilitation providers
