The Senate met from 9.30am until 7.37pm

The Senate will meet again on 26 February 2007.

Additional estimates 2006-07

Motion to disallow defeated

The Senate *did not agree* to a motion proposed by Senator Siewert which would have disallowed an <u>instrument</u> that determines the Australian national catch allocation for southern bluefin tuna for the 2006/2007 season. [first speaker]

- determination providing guidelines for the exercise of the power to give public interest certificates for the purposes of paragraph 208(1)(a) of the Social Security (Administration) Act 1999 by the Secretary of the Department of Employment and Workplace Relations
