#### Motion to disapprove defeated

The Senate *did not agree* to a motion moved by the Leader of the Australian Greens (Senator Bob Brown) which would have disapproved a <u>determination</u> that amends Remuneration Tribunal Determination 2005/19 – Principal Executive Office Classification Structure and Terms and Conditions.

A similar <u>notice</u> that had been set down for consideration on 10 September 2007 was withdrawn.

The Senate agreed to refer the Social Security and Other Legislation Amendment (Welfare Payment Reform) Bill 2007 and 4 related bills to the Legal and Constitutional Affairs Committee, at whatever stage the bills have reached at 12.45pm on 9 August 2007, for inquiry and report by 13 August 2007.

## **Proposed references**

The Senate <u>debated</u> a proposal to refer matters relating to the detention and release of <u>Dr Mohammed Haneef</u> to the Legal and Constitutional Affairs Committee. The debate is scheduled to continue on Thursday, 9 August 2007.

A proposal to refer matters relating to the impact of the Trade Practices (Horticulture Code of Conduct) Regulations 2006 to the Rural and Regional Affairs and Transport Committee was withdrawn.
