The following bills were introduced

- Customs Amendment (Australia-Chile Free Trade Agreement Implementation) Bill 2008 and a related bill [passed by the House of Representatives on 12 November 2008]
- □ Tax Laws Amendment (Education Refund) Bill 2008 [passed by the House of Representatives on 11 November 2008]
- □ Transport Security Amendment (2008 Measures No. 1) Bill 2008 [passed by the House of Representatives on 11 November 2008]

The following bill was debated

Same-Sex Relationships (Equal Treatment in Commonwealth Laws— General Law Reform) Bill 2008–second reading agreed to and committee of the whole commenced–<u>1 Government amendment</u> agreed to and 1 Part negatived [further amendments and requests remain to be considered]

The following bills were defeated by a majority vote

□ National Fuelwatch (Empowering Consumers) Bill 2008 and a related bill-<u>defeated</u> at the second reading [<u>first speaker</u>]

Same-Sex Relationships (Equal Treatment in Commonwealth Laws— Superannuation) Bill 2008–3 Government and 1 Opposition amendments agreed to and 2 Government requests for amendments agreed to [The House of Representatives will now consider the <u>amendments</u> requested by the Senate]

 Family Law Amendment (De Facto Financial Matters and Other Measures) Bill 2008–agreeing to the amendments made by the Senate [This bill will now be assented to]

- □ Offshore Petroleum Amendment (Greenhouse Gas Storage) Bill 2008–agreeing to the amendments made by the Senate [This bill will now be assented to]
- □ Safe Work Australia Bill 2008–insisting on disagreeing to the <u>amendments</u> made and insisted on by the Senate [The Senate will reconsider the amendments disagreed to by the House on a future sitting day]
