Health Insurance–Anti-competitive practices

A report by the Australian Competition and Consumer Commission on anticompetitive and other practices by health funds and providers in relation to private health insurance for the period 1 July 2006 to 30 June 2007 was tabled [The report was tabled in response to the order of the Senate agreed to on <u>25 March 1999</u> on the motion of Senator Harradine and amended on <u>18 September 2002</u>]

Ministerial statement tabled

The Minister for Climate Change and Water (Senator Wong) tabled a <u>ministerial</u> <u>statement</u> about the Wheat Export Marketing Bill 2008.

Documents discussed

Government documents, committee reports, government responses and Auditor-General's reports were discussed.

Motion debated

The Senate debated a <u>motion</u> moved by Senator Eggleston relating to the budget and the economy.
