Casual vacancy

The President announced the resignation on 5 May 2008 of Senator Robert Ray. <u>Senator Jacinta Collins</u> was sworn in as a senator for Victoria to fill the vacancy.

<u>Valedictory speeches</u> were made for Senator Ray.

Death of former senators

The President informed the Senate of the deaths of two former senators:

- on 27 March 2008, Ruth Nancy Coleman, a senator for Western Australia from 1974 to 1987—motion moved by the Leader of the Government in the Senate (Senator Evans) and supported
- on 8 April 2008, John Norman Button, a senator for Victoria from 1974 to 1993—motion moved by the Leader of the Government in the Senate (Senator Evans) and supported
