The following bills were introduced

- □ Offshore Petroleum (Annual Fees) Amendment (Greenhouse Gas Storage) Bill 2008 and 2 related bills [passed by the House of Representatives on 18 September 2008]
- ☐ Urgent Relief for Single Age Pensioners Bill 2008 [private senator's bill]

The following bills were debated

□ Tax Laws Amendment (Luxury Car Tax) Bill 2008 and 3 related bills—second reading further <u>debated</u> and agreed to and committee of the whole commenced–3 Opposition <u>requests for amendments</u> to be determined

The following private senator's bill was passed

□ Urgent Relief for Single Age Pensioners Bill 2008–a motion to give the bill precedence over government business was <u>debated</u>, <u>amended</u> and agreed to and the bill passed through all stages [The House of Representatives will now consider this bill]
