# Thursday, 26 June 2008

The Senate met from 9.30am until 7.44pm

The Senate has now completed the Winter sittings and will commence the Spring sittings on <u>26 August 2008</u> with the swearing in of senators elected on 24 November 2007 and the election of a new President.
