- □ Migration Legislation Amendment (Worker Protection) Bill 2008—second reading debate continued [first speaker]
- □ Water Amendment Bill 2008–<u>committee of the whole</u> continued– 1 Opposition, 1 Senator Xenophon, and 4 Australian Greens amendments agreed to, 1 Opposition amendment to be determined [further amendments remain to be considered]

□ Guarantee Scheme for Large Deposits and Wholesale Funding Appropriation Bill 2008 [This bill will now be assented to]

□ Same-Sex Relationships (Equal Treatment in Commonwealth Laws—General Law Reform) Bill 2008—a message was reported advising that the House had made the amendments requested by the Senate—the third reading of the bill was agreed to [The House of Representatives will now consider the amendments made by the Senate—see Journals entries no. 28, 12 November 2008 and no. 32, 24 November 2008]
