The Senate authorised the Electoral Matters Joint Committee to hold a public meeting while the Senate is sitting on 17 March 2009 for the committee's inquiry into the 2007 Federal Election, including the Commonwealth Electoral (Above-the-Line Voting) Amendment Bill 2008.
