Wednesday, 16 September 2009

The Senate met from 9.30am until 7.17pm

Motion to disallow debated

The Senate debated a motion to disallow the <u>Threat Abatement Plan</u> for disease in natural ecosystems caused by *Phytophthora cinnamomi* (2009), made under section 279 of the *Environment Protection and Biodiversity Conservation Act 1999* [first speaker]. The debate was adjourned till the first day in the next period of sittings (26 October 2009).

The Senate <u>ordered</u> that maps of Australian forest cover for each year since 1990 be tabled, no later than 4.00pm on 26 October 2009.
