Statement by Minister

The Parliamentary Secretary for Social Inclusion (Senator Stephens) made [a statement](#) about the order of the Senate [agreed to on [11 March 2009](#)] requiring the tabling of documents concerning information relating to the Department of the Treasury modelling, *Australia's Low Pollution Future: The economics of climate change mitigation*—no later than noon on 13 March 2009. The Minister indicated that the documents would not be provided. [Senator Cormann](#) and the Leader of the Australian Greens ([Senator Bob Brown](#)) made statements in response.
