Bills considered

The following bills were introduced

- Building and Construction Industry Improvement Amendment (Transition to Fair Work) Bill 2009 [passed by the House of Representatives on 13 August 2009]
- National Greenhouse and Energy Reporting Amendment Bill 2009 [passed by the House of Representatives on 12 August 2009]
- □ Road Transport Reform (Dangerous Goods) Repeal Bill 2009 [passed by the House of Representatives on 13 August 2009]

 Higher Education Legislation Amendment (Student Services and Amenities, and Other Measures) Bill 2009–second reading agreed to [first speaker] and committee of the whole commenced–<u>1 Government</u> <u>amendment</u> agreed to [a further amendment remains to be considered]

Motion agreed to

The Senate ordered the Minister representing the Minister for the Environment, Heritage and the Arts (Senator Wong) to table <u>documents</u> relating to the Australian Terrestrial Biodiversity Assessment 2008 by no later than 20 August 2009.

Notice of motion given

Senator Cormann gave a <u>notice of motion</u> to require the Minister representing the Minister for Health and Ageing (Senator Ludwig) to table documents relating to budget measures concerning chemotherapy treatment–no later than 12.00pm on 19 August 2009

Departmental and agency contracts published on the Internet

A letter of advice for the Veterans' Affairs portfolio was tabled [Letters of advice about certain contracts valued at \$100 000 or more entered into by departments and agencies are required to be tabled twice a year]

Indexed lists of departmental and agency files published on the Internet

A statement of compliance for the Australian Trade Commission was tabled [Letters of advice about certain files created by departments and agencies are <u>required to be tabled</u> twice a year]

Unproclaimed legislation

A document was tabled showing details of unproclaimed Acts, together with a statement of reasons for non-proclamation and a timetable for their operation [Standing order 139(2) requires tabling before 31 August each year]
