

Senate Daily Summary

Wednesday, 18 March 2009

The Senate met from 9.30am until 7.56pm

Legislation

Bills considered

The following bills were introduced

- Australian Business Investment Partnership Bill 2009 and a related bill [passed by the House of Representatives on 17 March 2009]
- Migration Amendment (Abolishing Detention Debt) Bill 2009 [new Senate bill]
- Social Security Amendment (Liquid Assets Waiting Period) Bill 2009 [passed by the House of Representatives on 18 March 2009]
- Social Security and Veterans' Entitlements Amendment (Commonwealth Seniors Health Card) Bill 2009 [passed by the House of Representatives on 17 March 2009]

The following bill was debated

Fair Work Bill 2008–Committee of the whole continued–3 Australian Greens <u>amendments agreed to</u> and 1 clause negatived [further amendments remain to be considered]

The following bills were defeated by a majority vote

Customs Tariff Amendment (2009 Measures No. 1) Bill 2009
Excise Tariff Amendment (2009 Measures No. 1) Bill 2009

Messages from the House of Representatives were reported informing the Senate that the House had not made the amendments requested by the Senate [first speaker]. The committee resolved not to press its requests. An <u>amendment</u> to the motion that the report of the committee be adopted was moved by the Leader of the Australian Greens (Senator Bob Brown) and Senator Cormann and agreed to [a message will be sent to the House of Representatives].

The bills were defeated at the third reading [see Journals entries nos 27 and 29].

Exemption from the cut-off order [to enable consideration in this period of sittings]

The Senate agreed to exempt the following bills from the cut-off order:

- □ Social Security Amendment (Liquid Assets Waiting Period) Bill 2009
- Social Security and Veterans' Entitlements Amendment (Commonwealth Seniors Health Card) Bill 2009
- □ Tax Laws Amendment (2009 Measures No. 1) Bill 2009

The Senate did not agree to exempt the following bills from the cut-off order [first speaker]:

- Commonwealth Electoral Amendment (Political Donations and Other Measures) Bill 2009
