### 1.3 Business conducted in the Senate

#### Types of business in the Senate:

**Business of the Senate** includes disallowance motions, presentation of committee reports, motions to refer matters to standing committees, motions for leave of absence to a senator and motions concerning the qualification of a senator. It has precedence over government business and general business for the day on which it is listed, except Monday and Tuesday, between 12.30 and 2 pm, and Wednesday between 9.30 am and 12.45 pm.

**Government business** is business initiated by a minister and includes all debate on government bills. Government business takes precedence over general business except for a period of  $2\frac{1}{2}$  hours on Thursdays.


**General business** is initiated by senators who are not ministers. It includes motions to take note of answers, most notices of motion, consideration of committee reports and government responses and matters of public interest. General business takes precedence over government business on Thursdays as described above.

**Questions** include question time and additional answers given by ministers at the end of question time.

Urgency motions and matters of public importance (MPIs) may be proposed by senators on any sitting day pursuant to standing order 75. At the conclusion of the debate there is no vote taken on the substantive issue of the matter or motion. However, in the case of urgency motions, a procedural vote is taken as to whether the matter is considered urgent or not.


Other business includes prayers, petitions, postponements and ceremonial business.

**Adjournment**: Note that the time for the adjournment debate is not included in the figures shown.




Total time, by type of business - 1 January to 31 December 2006

# Percentage of time, by type of business: 1 January to 31 December 2006 and breakdown of government business





### Proportion of time spent according to the type of business: 1997 to 2006




## Number of sitting days: 1987 to 2006




### Average length of a sitting day: 1987 to 2006




Total Senate sitting times: 1987 to 2006

## 2.4 Committee of the whole—Consideration

The *committee of the whole* process provides an opportunity for senators to consider bills in detail. Amendments moved in committee of the whole seek to change, delete or add words in the bill that may affect the final content of the law. Where – under the Constitution – the Senate cannot directly amend a bill, it may instead *request* the House of Representatives to amend the bill before agreeing to it.

## 2.7 Amendments and requests—Disagreements

Before it can become a law, a bill must be agreed to by both the Senate and the House of Representatives in precisely the same form. If there is a disagreement over amendments or requests, a bill may be transmitted between the two Houses a number of times until the Houses finally agree to it in the same form or it is abandoned. These negotiations on amendments and requests are conducted by the consideration of *messages* between the Houses. The details of this consideration are listed below.

## Trade Practices Legislation Amendment Bill (No. 1) 2005

The House agreed to 5 amendments made by the Senate, disagreed to 1 and made 49 amendments in its place, and made 9 further amendments (18 October 2006).

The Senate did not insist on its amendment, agreed to the amendments made by the House—7 Family First amendments were moved and agreed to, 8 Senator Joyce amendments were moved and negatived (19 October 2006).

The House agreed to the further amendments made by the Senate (19 October 2006). Bill passed both Houses.

# 2.8 Bills, or provisions of bills, referred to committees

Bills may be referred to committees at any stage for inquiry and report. The *provisions* of many bills are referred before the bill is received from the House of Representatives to maximise the time available for the committee inquiry.

Committees may table reports on any sitting day, or may present them when the Senate is not sitting, in which case the report is tabled on the next available sitting day.

## 3.1 Notices of motion for disallowance

Many Acts of Parliament delegate to the executive government the power to make detailed rules and regulations (*delegated legislation*). Regulations and most other instruments made in this way are subject to the power of either House to veto or *disallow* them.

In most cases, within 15 sitting days after tabling a senator may give notice of a motion to disallow the regulations. If the motion is agreed to, the regulations are disallowed and cease to have effect. If a notice of motion to disallow regulations has not been resolved or withdrawn within 15 sitting days after having been given, the regulations are *deemed* to have been disallowed and they automatically cease to have effect.

The power to require the production of information is one of the most significant powers available to a legislature to enable it to carry out its functions of scrutinising legislation and the performance of the executive arm of government.

Orders for the production of documents most frequently require the tabling of documents in the possession of ministers, government departments and agencies, although occasionally an order may require the creation of the document in question. The order will generally describe the documents sought and specify a date for their tabling.
