Please accept this submission for the JSCEM's Inquiry into the 2007 Federal El ecti on.

I have been living overseas for many years, but I visit Australia frequently and remained on the

electoral roll (electorate of Perth, WA) until 10 years ago, when my name was removed. I visit Australia

regularly, as my immediate family (brother, sister, and both parents until their recent deaths) live in

Perth, WA. I pay Australian tax on my Australian income and remain in close contact with Australian

affairs. I am a citizen of Australia and of no other country. I cannot vote in any election in my

country of residence (Germany).

I have been distressed for years that the Australian electoral law does not permit Australian citizens

overseas to play a full role in the political processes of their country. The United States changed its

electoral law some years ago to allow all US citizens to vote in Presidential elections, and I would

welcome similar changes to our laws. At the very least, it should be possible for overseas Australians

to stay on the electoral role for a much longer period than now possible, with the right (if necessary)

to extend this in an easy manner.

There are many people in $m\!y$ situation. Australia matters to us, and we think that it is our right to

play a role expected of Australian citizens resident in Australia. I shall be following developments and

hope for significant changes.
