I am one of the many disenfranchised Australians living abroad, and feel strongly about current situation where I am no longer able to voice my opinions electorally, when it comes to the future of my country.

I moved to the United Kingdom in 2004 to understand another way of life, and to widen my professional experience in healthcare, and I maintain the belief that I when I choose to return to Australia, the wealth of my experience gained abroad, will be put to good use to benefit other Australians.

It is important to me to maintain my strong links with friends and family in Australia, and thankfully for the Internet, I am able to keep track of the everyday goings on, both locally in Melbourne, where I am from, and nationally.

When I left Australia, I ensured that I contacted the Electoral Office to advise that despite moving abroad, I still wished to be included on the electoral role. I did not vote in the 2004 election, as I was travelling, and at that time, unaware of the process of voting in such circumstances.

When I became aware of the possibility of a 2007 election, I also became aware through The Southern Cross website, that I may have been removed from the electoral role for not voting in 2004. This was certainly the case, and when I attempted to re-register, I found that I was no longer eligible to do so after having been away from Australia for 3 years and 2 months. I was bitterly disappointed, firstly as I was not aware of this arrangement that actively disenfranchises Australians, but also as I am a passionate Australian who believes that we should all have the right of voting for a better future. Just because I am not living in Australia at this present moment, does not mean that I have no concern for my country.

I believe clearer and more accessible information regarding remaining on the electoral role, should be made available to those travelling abroad. feel changes need to be made to remove the 3 year cut off point for re-enrollment eligibility.
