Dear Members of the Joint Standing Electoral Review Committee,

My Name is Rhys Raymond Morgan Address: 43 Davies Road, Ashgrove, Qld 4060.

I think we all agree that the end result of the way the senate vote was 'gamed' for the end result of ultra-minor parties being elected in 3 states is a poor end result for our electoral process.

I have long been an advocate for preferential voting when compared with a first passed the post system unless you are prepared to have a series of run-off elections which is a crazy waste of money. Our system has worked well in the past but not now under the present rules. Something has to change I suggest some or all of the below suggestions should be implemented.

- Individuals can only be a member of one political party (this stops and individual starting up a dozen quasi parties just prior to an election).
- There should be a real minimal number of paid up members for a party to be registered (eg 400).
- There should be a real cost in registering a party (eg \$1,000-2,000)
- Parties must have been in existence for 3 months before they are eligible to put themselves forward for an election. During this time they need to have held boni-fidi meetings of the members with appropriate minutes to demonstrate they are a legitimate party
- Parties should NOT be allowed to determine the preference of the voter it must be the preference of the individual voter or there needs to be run off elections which no one wants
- I respectfully suggest there should be no above the line voting or if it is allowed, it should be modified so as to allow the voter to express a limited number of preferences (eg 4). If their 'redistributed vote falls to an candidate that does not have a quota, then the vote drops out of the system.

Please fix the broken system and return democracy to the people. A small number of quasi-party people should not be able to determine how 15-20% of the senate vote is distributed. That is an abuse of the system and it needs to be eliminated
