There is an urgent need to find ways for men to communicate, to lessen the high suicide rate in rural areas. Furthermore, the broadening of skills, presents opportunities for members of a group, such as a Men's Shed, to help improve the appearance of country towns, to the benefit of the whole community.

I submit that the infrastructure, and the financial support, via grants, that previously existed for the Wheatbelt Area Consultative Committee, should be included in any new funding program. This would minimize administrative costs, and duplication for taxpayers.
