INQUIRY INTO AUSTRALIA'S RELATIONSHIP WITH THE COUNTRIES OF AFRICA

The Australian mining industry has followed with considerable interest moves by the Federal Government to elevate Australia's level of engagement with Africa, as evidenced by the Joint Standing Committee on Foreign Affairs, Defence and Trade (**JSCFADT**) Inquiry into Australia's Relationship with the Countries of Africa.

The Federal Government also has acknowledged the significant economic and social role played by Australian mining companies in Africa and has engaged the mining and minerals sector in a dialogue to canvass areas of mutual interest and concern. I am writing on behalf of the Australia Africa Mining Industry Group (**AAMIG**), which has been established to represent Australian mining companies in Africa in that process.

I am pleased to inform the Joint Standing Committee of this initiative and to enclose a submission prepared by Mr Richard Yeates on behalf of AAMIG for the Committee's consideration. It is perhaps symbolic that this submission to the Joint Standing Committee is the first formal action undertaken by AAMIG. Re: Australia's Relations with Africa

Thank you for the opportunity to comment on Australia's relations with Africa, as part of the Inquiry by the Joint Standing Committee on Foreign Affairs, Defence and Trade.

Introduction

At the recommendation of DFAT, the Australian mining industry is in the process of convening a formal committee to represent the views and interests of the Australian mineral exploration, mining and mining service sector operating in Africa. The interim committee, to be known as the 'Australia-Africa Mining Industry Group' (AAMIG) comprises Mr Greg Walker General Manager International Affairs with Paladin Energy Limited as interim Chairman, Mr Bill Repard Executive Chairman of Paydirt Media Pty Ltd (the entity responsible for the Africa Downunder Conference) and President of the Australia-South Africa Business Council, and myself, Richard Yeates Managing Director of unlisted African exploration company Middle Island Resources Limited and formerly Principal of mining consulting firm RSG Global (now Coffey Mining) as founding host sponsor of the Africa Downunder Conference.

The interim committee of AAMIG has identified and approached influential individuals within the Australian mining sector with extensive interests and experience in Africa to comprise the formal committee of AAMIG. It is intended that this group will meet on an approximate bi-monthly basis, with the ADU Conference in Perth in early September and the Mining Indaba Conference in Cape Town in early February each year providing two more logical meeting opportunities that would include relevant Australian Government agencies.

As the full committee of AAMIG has not yet convened, this submission cannot adequately represent the views of all Australian companies within the African mining sector, but rather serves to provide the following:-

- A baseline overview of the Australian mining sector in Africa.
- A brief summary of Australian mining sector activities that may be relevant to this enquiry.
- Suggest possible ways in which the Australian mining sector might assist government agencies in re-engaging with Africa.

Overview of the Australian Mining Sector in Africa

Some 150 ASX listed or Australian based mining and exploration companies, with a collective market capitalisation of over A\$260 billion, are presently active on the ground in 40 African countries. This number includes 28 companies that presently have, or have an interest in, mining operations in 17 different African countries.

Lists of ASX listed companies operating in Africa are attached as Appendix 1, courtesy of Intierra Resource Intelligence.

In addition to mining and exploration companies, the mining service sector also represents a significant contribution, with some 30 Australian companies estimated to have African-based operations and

a further 50 Australian firms estimated to be routinely involved in African assignments on a campaign basis from Australia.

While it is not possible to accurately determine what these entities have collectively invested over the last 10 years, in excess of A\$20 billion can be readily accounted for. In short, Australian investment and involvement in the African mining sector is considerable and growing.

Summary of Relevant Australian Mining Sector Activities

In 2003, Paydirt Media (as organiser) and RSG Global (as major sponsor) initiated the concept of an Australian mining investment conference focussed on Africa. A twofold purpose was clearly established to underpin what has now become the highly successful annual Africa Downunder Conference (ADU) held in Perth, attracting some 1,000 international delegates and up to 12 African government delegations.

Via this vanguard event itself and the strong associated media coverage, the first objective was to provide a forum for Australian mining and exploration companies operating in Africa to demonstrate the mineral potential of the continent to domestic investors and change often superficially negative perceptions of Africa as an investment destination.

Secondly, the conference was designed to provide a forum for African government delegations and agencies to present investment opportunities and legislative advances to encourage additional Australian investment to their respective countries and the African minerals sector in general.

In terms of the event's success, the number of Australian exploration and mining companies operating in Africa has increased dramatically over this period, now numbering some 150. At the same time Australian investment in the African mining and service sector has risen to >A\$20 billion, and the credibility of Africa as an attractive investment destination has been considerably enhanced. Numerous major projects are now in production or under construction and continue to provide considerable financial and social benefits to all stakeholders.

At the same time, anecdotal advice from the rapidly growing number of African government delegations attending the ADU conference indicates that the forum has directly resulted in a considerable and tangible increase in Australian direct foreign investment in the mining and associated service sector within their countries.

This vanguard conference has readily achieved its intended objectives and these will no doubt be considerably advanced in future years. In 2007, the Canadian mining industry modelled a similar forum on the Africa Downunder concept, referred to as 'Mine Africa'. We applaud them for doing so, as this can only be in the best interests of African mining communities.

We wish to acknowledge the role of the Australian Department of Foreign Affairs and Trade, including Austrade. Not only has DFAT been an active supporter of the Africa Downunder Conference in recent years, but the department has introduced a number of initiatives to support the Australian mining sector in Africa, including the extremely popular 'Australian Lounge' concept introduced at the annual Mining Indaba Conference in Cape Town in 2007, and we thank relevant Ministers, Austrade and the High Commissioners for their on-going support.

Australian mining companies continue to build an extremely sound reputation for their environmental and social responsibility in an international context, including Africa. The majority of companies prefer to transpose more onerous, but familiar, Australian standards in relation to safety, and environmental and social requirements, rather than adopt the often less onerous international standards or those of the jurisdictions in which they operate.

In addition to considerable direct foreign investment in Africa by way of their core business of exploration, feasibility studies, project construction, and mining and processing operations, the Aus-

tralian mining sector is also actively involved in establishing and managing social development programmes proximal to their operations and actively undertaking or sponsoring training initiatives. These programmes are extremely diverse, ranging from the establishment of civil infrastructure such as villages, potable water supplies, schools, clinics and community centres, along with the staffing and funding of these, while other activities include commercial agriculture and aquaculture projects, enterprise development programmes, workforce health education, professional training courses, and the sponsoring of tertiary and post graduate students.

There is a clear recognition by the Australian mining sector that as Australian professional and trade skills shortages continue to impact, the global mining industry will become increasingly reliant on regions such as Africa, South America and Eastern Europe as a source of these skills. Mining and mining service companies are routinely offering professional training programmes throughout Africa, providing professional development opportunities to mining companies for national staff.

The Australian mining sector has done an excellent job in identifying and training national mining professionals and trades-people, many of whom are now utilising their skills throughout Africa and beyond, with earnings being repatriated to their home countries. Ghana, as a more mature African mining economy, represents a prime example. Not only has Ghana itself prospered as a nation on the back of developing mineral wealth, but is now exporting professional and technical mining personnel globally.

Possible Australian Mining Sector Assistance in Re-engaging with Africa

Relative to the terms of reference of the inquiry, the mining sector considers it can most effectively contribute to *'economic issues, including trade and investment', 'cultural, scientific and educational relations and exchanges' and 'development assistance cooperation and capacity building'.*

First and foremost, the Australian Mining sector's contribution to Africa in terms of trade and investment is already considerable as previously stated and this aspect will only continue to expand with improving stability. In an African context this has been a 'two steps forwards, one step backwards' approach, however the overall improvement since the late 1990's is clearly evident and continues in this fashion.

Secondly, the next most direct and obvious manner in which Australian mining and service companies can facilitate the re-engagement with Africa is via a public-private partnership in delivering social development assistance, with the Australian Government providing supplementary funding for approved programmes. Such a partnership would provide numerous advantages to both Government and private enterprise as follows:-

- Ensure that the relatively limited available government aid funding is applied to maximise social, financial, political and strategic advantage.
- A mining operation or mining development project provides an immediate commercial focus for the delivery and management of proximal social development programmes.
- Programmes could be branded as 'AusAID' or 'Australian' projects, with the government attracting additional kudos.
- Government agencies and/or their independent consultants could ensure that the programmes are appropriately implemented, managed and measured, and are consistent with UN regional objectives.

It is important to stress that companies do not see this concept as an opportunity to abrogate responsibility for planned social development assistance, but rather a mechanism to increase the scope of these programmes, and implement and manage them in a more strategic way.

The only negative element from a Government perspective would appear to be the potential per-

ception of being associated with a private mining project in general terms, and more particularly in the event that an environmental or social incident occurs. Irrespective, we are confident that this concept does not significantly increase the inherent risk associated with any development programme, and an appropriate mechanism can be established to mitigate against this possibility, with the potential benefits far outweighing any negative elements.

To facilitate this initiative, the soon to be convened AAMIG plans to undertake a survey of all Australian mining sector companies operating in Africa to build an inventory of current and planned social development activities and associated investment.

A third area of possible assistance is in the provision and/or sponsorship of professional development training to facilitate capacity building in areas associated with the mining sector. This might include areas such as mineral legislation and tenure management, geological and hydrological surveys, environmental monitoring and compliance, workforce health education and occupational safety compliance. Several Australian companies are already participating in such activities by way of sponsorship and/or delivery of training.

Conclusions & Recommendations

Further to several consultative meetings with Government, the Australian mining industry is in the process of convening a formal committee to represent the views and interests of the Australian mineral exploration, mining and mining service sector operating in Africa. It is intended that this group, to be known as the 'Australia-Africa Mining Industry Group' (AAMIG), will meet on an approximate bi-monthly basis.

In terms of the Australian mining industry profile in Africa, some 150 ASX listed mining and exploration companies, with a collective market capitalisation of over A\$260 billion, are presently active on the ground in 40 different African countries. A further 80 mining service companies are estimated to have African-based operations or are routinely involved in African assignments. These public and private entities have collectively invested in excess of A\$20 billion over the last 10 years. In short, Australian investment and involvement in the African mining sector is considerable and growing, providing a valuable resource to the Government in any re-engagement with Africa.

Inaugurated by Paydirt Media in 2003, the annual Africa Downunder Conference (ADU) held in Perth attracts some 1,000 international delegates and up to 12 African government delegations. Since the event's inception, the number of Australian exploration and mining companies operating in Africa has increased dramatically, the forum has directly resulted in a considerable and tangible increase in Australian direct foreign investment in the mining and associated service sector in Africa, the credibility of Africa as an attractive investment destination in the Australian market has been considerably enhanced, and new mining project developments continue to provide considerable financial and social benefits to all stakeholders.

Australian mining companies continue to build an enviable reputation for their environmental and social responsibility in an international context, including Africa. Companies are actively involved in establishing and managing social development programmes proximal to their operations and actively initiating or sponsoring professional and technical development training initiatives. These programmes are extremely diverse, ranging from the establishment, staffing and funding of civil infrastructure projects, developing commercial agriculture and aquaculture projects, enterprise development programmes and facilitating workforce health education, professional training courses, and sponsoring tertiary and post graduate education. There is a clear recognition by the Australian mining sector that as the mining professional and technical skills shortage continues to impact, the global mining industry will become increasingly reliant on regions such as Africa as a future source of these skills.

The most direct and obvious manner in which Australian mining and service companies can facili-

tate the re-engagement with Africa is via a public-private partnership in delivering social development assistance that ensure the relatively limited available government aid funding is applied to maximum social, financial, political and strategic advantage. A mining operation or mining development project provides an immediate commercial focus for the delivery and management of social development programmes that could be branded as 'AusAID' or 'Australian' projects. Government agencies and/or their independent consultants could ensure that the programmes are appropriately implemented and managed, and are consistent with UN regional objectives. It is important to stress that companies do not see this concept as an opportunity to abrogate responsibility for planned social development initiatives, but rather a mechanism to increase the scope of these programmes, and implement and manage them in a more strategic way. The only negative element from a Government perspective would appear to be the potential perception of being associated with a private mining project. Irrespective, we are confident that an appropriate mechanism can be established to mitigate against this possibility. AAMIG plans to undertake a survey of all Australian mining sector companies operating in Africa to build an inventory of current and planned social development activities and related investment in order to facilitate this proposition.

A second area of possible assistance is in the provision and/or sponsorship of professional development training to facilitate capacity building in areas associated with the mining sector, potentially including areas such as mineral legislation and tenure management, geological and hydrological surveys, environmental monitoring and compliance, workforce health education and occupational safety compliance.

AAMIG is genuinely committed to supporting Australia's long overdue re-engagement with Africa and wishes to thank the Joint Standing Committee for the opportunity to provide comment. We trust that this information proves of use to the inquiry and stand ready to support any outcomes. AAMIG's interim Chairman, Mr Greg Walker, has agreed to participate in the enquiry if required to appear in person.
