My family and I are totally opposed to the formulation of the International Criminal Court for the following reasons –

It would be a surrender of Australia's sovereignty

To surrender our sovereignty would be a violation of our Constitution, and would border on treason by the Executive Government

The objectivity and independence of the Prosecutor would be dangerously subjected to powerful and well-funded Non-Government Organisations

The intended function of this court was to deal with the Crime of Genocide and Human Rights Abuses, however I believe that separate temporary courts set up for specific investigations are more appropriate and pose a lesser threat to nations and their sovereignty.

The powers of an International Criminal Court would be dangerously abused to further the social engineering presently carried out by well-funded minority groups.
