I believe it is important to invite people to share their ethnic culture with us so we can learn how they live and they can still enjoy some form of culture and community, but that does not mean we have to share their values or agree with their worldview, the values that make this great nation what it is need to remain unchanged.

People that migrate to Australia need to understand that we live in and enjoy a democracy and do not want that changed.

I am concerned for Australia that it may be headed in the same direction as other European countries. We have a great nation and we want it to stay that way, therefore assimiliation is of utmost importance, learning the language, education and employment are critical for people migrating to Australia, that contribution is made like that of the early migrants.

I therefore hope that you consider carefully the submissions that you receive as this is a very important stage for Australia. I do hope that we as a nation will go forward and continue strong as a democracy.
