Private senators' bills to be debated

On 14 November 2013 the Senate agreed to a temporary order allowing private senators' bills to be considered on Thursdays. On 5 March 2015 the Environment Protection and Biodiversity Conservation Amendment Bill 2014 is scheduled for debate

<u>Letters</u> of advice for various portfolios were tabled [Letters of advice about certain contracts valued at \$100 000 or more entered into by departments and agencies are required to be tabled twice a year]

Letters of advice for various portfolios were tabled [Lists of all grants approved are <u>required</u> to be tabled 7 days before the commencement of budget, supplementary budget and additional estimates hearings]

Departmental and agency unanswered questions on notice-Estimates hearings

Statements for various portfolios were tabled [Letters of advice in relation to questions taken on notice are required to be tabled by not later than 10 days before the commencement of the budget estimates, supplementary budget estimates and additional estimates hearings [Journals entries nos $\underline{2}$ and y refer]

Indexed lists of departmental and agency files published on the Internet

<u>Statements</u> of compliance were tabled [Letters of advice about certain files created by departments and agencies are <u>required to be tabled</u> twice a year]
