Wednesday, 19 August 2015

The Senate met from 9.30 am until 7.57 pm

Omnibus Repeal Day (Spring 2014) Bill 2014—consideration of message in committee of the whole—Message reporting that the House of Representatives had not agreed to amendments made by the Senate, and the <u>amendments were considered in committee of the whole</u> [The Senate insisted on its amendments (nos 1 to 6), and made an amendment in place of amendment no. 7). [The House of Representatives will now further consider the amendments made by the Senate]
