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The Committee recommends that the Government introduce a system partial optional preferential voting below the line. It proposes that:	
voters should be instructed on the ballot paper to mark a minimum of 12 preferences to vote below the line; and	37
a related vote savings provision for below the line votes be introduced to ensure that any ballot with at least six boxes numbere in a sequential order (starting at '1') be considered formal.
