The Support for Day to Day Living in the Community (D2DL) programme and Partners in Recovery (PIR) initiative are in-scope for the National Disability Insurance Scheme (NDIS), with these programmes expected to provide services to NDIS clients at relevant NDIS trial sites. In-scope organisations are required to meet NDIS reporting requirements in order to track and monitor the interface with the NDIS.

The interface between PIR and the NDIS will also be explored through the national PIR evaluation.
