Senator Rachel Siewert asked:

What was the exact date that trial participants could select Savings or Cheque when making purchases?

How much are Credit transaction fees for using the CDC? What is the maximum charge someone has received?

## Answer:

On 21 November 2016, the Cashless Debit Card was upgraded to be a dual Visa/EFTPOS card and participants could select 'Savings' or 'Cheque' so that the transaction would be routed via the EFTPOS network.

Merchants may levy surcharges on transactions if purchasers are using an electronic payment method. The amount charged per transaction is at the merchant's discretion. Only a small number of merchants in trial regions levy merchant surcharges. The maximum fixed surcharge the Department is aware of having been charged is two dollars.
