- a) Please provide the total number of Commonwealth Rent Assistance recipients, by category and state.
- b) The number of Commonwealth Rent Assistance recipients currently in housing stress (>30 per cent of gross income on housing costs unless otherwise defined)
- c) The number of Commonwealth Rent Assistance recipients who would be in housing stress if Rent Assistance was increased by:
 - i) \$15
 - ii) \$25.

The general order of priority is: Pensions; Allowances; Family Tax Benefit (FTB). Parenting Payment (Partnered) will be reported for income units where one member receives Parenting Payment and their partner is not receiving any other income support payment. They will only be reported as receiving FTB Part A if neither receives a social security payment.

- (b) The number and percentage of CRA recipients (income units) under rental stress as at 30 September 2016 were 547,564 and 40.8 per cent of all CRA recipients at September 2016 respectively (note that about 1 per cent of income units in receipt of CRA are excluded from housing stress calculations due to data limitations).
- (c) The Commonwealth Rent Assistance (CRA) architecture does not allow for modelling these scenarios. The Department would be unable to answer this question without making significant assumptions or heavily qualifying the response and may provide misleading housing stress scenarios.
