Senator Reynolds asked:

The NDIA previously informed the committee that 2,058 young people in residential aged care were scheduled to transition into the NDIS in the 2016-17 financial year. In this current financial year, broken down by NDIS roll out site, how many of these young people:

- i. were scheduled to come into the NDIS;
- ii. have been found eligible for the NDIS;
- iii. have been allocated a planner;
- iv. actually have a funded plan in place that has been activated?

Answer:

The table below shows the current status (as at 31 December 2016) of young people in residential aged care living in geographical areas where the National Disability Insurance Scheme will be operating by 30 June 2017.

Data was available on 1,903 young people in residential aged care. Of these 374 have an approved plan and a further 97 are eligible, but are yet to have a plan approved.

No data is available on those who have been “allocated a planner” or who have activated their plan.
