Topic: CHRONIC DISEASE DENTAL SCHEME (CDDS)

Written Question on Notice

Senator Adams asked:

- a) Given that the Government policy is to terminate the Chronic Disease Dental Scheme by 31 December 2011, can the Department outline what steps are currently being taken to facilitate the termination of the programme?
- b) Given that \$1.6 billion has been spent on this programme over the last 2 years, can the Government provide a breakdown of how the \$1.6 billion was spent?
- c) Does the Department have a Programme that will replace this scheme?

Answer:

- a) The date of 31 December 2011 is included in the 2011-12 Budget documentation in recognition of the continued operation of the Chronic Disease Dental Scheme (the Scheme) and the need to make provision for funding its costs in the near term. While it is Government policy to close the Scheme because the Senate has blocked the closure of the Scheme, an actual closure date has not been determined and is not presently before the Parliament.
- b) Over financial years 2009-10 and 2010-11 (to 30 April 2011), \$1,164,845,493 in Medicare benefits was paid under the Scheme.
