**Senator Siewert** asked:

Which agency or organisation has been selected to deliver the new Financial Wellbeing Service in Amata and Mimili and when is this service expected to start?

How many Full-Time Equivalent staff will the Financial Wellbeing Service employ and how many of these staff will work and live in Amata or Mimili?

How many individuals is the Family Wellbeing Service expected to provide one-on-one support to in its first 12 months of operating and what outcomes will be used to measure the effectiveness of this support?

**Answer:**

Matrix on Board has been selected to deliver the Financial Wellbeing Service in Amata and Mimili.

Matrix on Board is currently establishing the service and a staged rollout of service provision will commence from July 2012.

The service will employ local people wherever possible, with two Anangu people already employed as part-time Financial Education Workers.
