#### **Senator Siewert** asked:

How many houses refurbished under SIHIP in the Northern Territory have been placed under tenancy agreements, by community?

How many houses refurbished under SIHIP in the Northern Territory have not been placed under tenancy agreements, by community?

#### **Answer:**

The following table represents the total number of tenancy agreements under the *Residential Tenancies Act* (NT) signed in relation to refurbished houses which are part of the Northern Territory Government's remote housing stock as at 31 May 2012.

Signing people to tenancy agreements is an ongoing process, and this table represents data at a point in time. Before a tenancy agreement is signed and the new tenants move into the house, the tenants must complete an Intensive Tenancy Support (ITS) program to prepare for their rights and responsibilities as tenants. The program provides support about social issues in remote communities such as transitional housing, managing money and resources, managing visitors and overcrowding and maintaining a safe, clean and healthy house. Some houses require further works to become compliant with the *Residential Tenancies Act* and therefore a tenancy agreement cannot be signed. In these cases, the occupants sign an Occupancy Information Document (OID), which is a formal agreement under which occupants receive a service for a fee paid in line with arrangements prior to the current reforms (poll tax).

As at 31 May 2012, the number of tenancy agreements in place for refurbished houses are as follows:
