## **Question:**

What I would like to know, under the health components: the breakdown of the programs, and what the funding has been for each of those as far as possible. The gross figures I have do not give any indication of that or any indication of what is going to be on target and what is not.

#### Answer:

There are seven Health elements of the Stronger Futures Package, as follows:

- Stronger Indigenous Health Services;
- Remote Area Health Corps;
- Structural Reform of Health Services;
- Hearing Health Program;
- Oral Health Program;
- Alcohol Management Plans; and
- Mobile Outreach Service Plus.

A table listing the seven Health elements and their budgets for 2012-13 is provided at Attachment A. The response provided to Question on Notice E13-220 lists the Health elements and progress against their annual targets.
