Senator Siewert asked:

- 1. What is the total Federal Government contribution to NT alcohol harm reduction programs, by Department?
- 2. How much of that is delivered directly, and how much is delivered in partnership with the state Government?

Answer:

- 1) The Australian Government has currently allocated around \$127 million over the next 10 years (2012-2022) to directly support alcohol harm reduction programs in the Northern Territory. In addition to this funding, the Australian Government delivers a number of programs that support these directly funded alcohol harm reduction programs such as the Stronger Futures in the Northern Territory Community Safety and Justice measure and the National Partnership on Remote Indigenous Housing Program.
- 2) Table one details funding contributions by Department for directly funded alcohol harm reduction activities and their mode of delivery.
