Lodge management is working with a Darwin-based Indigenous Employment Provider, Karen Sheldon Training, to source additional Indigenous employees.

² As at 30 June 2013, 4 Indigenous employees were employed by Nitmiluk Tours to conduct cultural tours at Cicada Lodge, representing 11.36% of the total workforce associated with the Lodge.
