#### **Senator McKenzie** asked:

Can you please provide an overview of Federal Government programs available to students, the total cost of these programs, the number of students in regional Victoria (outside of metropolitan Melbourne) eligible for assistance, and the number of students participating in these programs? eg. Austudy, Abstudy, and Youth Allowance?

#### **Answer:**

## **ABSTUDY**

The ABSTUDY scheme addresses the particular educational disadvantages faced by Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander people by providing support to students and Australian Apprentices to access and participate in education and training. The scheme provides a means-tested living allowance and a range of supplementary benefits for full-time Indigenous students and apprentices. Some supplementary benefits are available to part-time students.

#### Austudy

Austudy is a means-tested payment for students aged 25 years and over who are undertaking qualifying full-time study at an approved educational institution or undertaking a full-time Australian Apprenticeship. It is designed to encourage people to undertake further education and training.

#### Youth Allowance (student)

Youth Allowance is a means-tested payment which provides assistance to young people aged 16 to 24 years who are in full-time education, training or a full-time Australian Apprenticeship. It is designed to encourage people to undertake further education and training.

### Rent Assistance

Students living away from home may also be eligible to receive Rent Assistance. Rent Assistance is an additional form of support available to students receiving student payments to help with the costs of accommodation. The amount payable is based on the amount of rent paid by the student above a specified rent threshold, and whether the person is sharing the accommodation with others.

#### Student Start-up Scholarships

Higher education students receiving student payments are also eligible for Student Start-up Scholarships, paid in two half-yearly instalments totalling \$2,050 in 2013 to assist with the up-front costs of items such as textbooks and specialised equipment.

#### **Relocation Scholarships**

Dependent higher education students receiving student payments, who are required to live away from home (and some independent higher education students who are disadvantaged by their personal circumstances and unable to live in the parental home), are also eligible for Relocation Scholarships to assist with the costs of establishing and maintaining accommodation. Regional higher education students receive a higher payment in recognition that they generally have higher costs in relocating to study. In 2013, regional students received \$4,048 in the first year they live away from home, \$2,024 in the second and third years and \$1,012 a year thereafter. In 2013, metropolitan students received \$4,048 in the first year they live away from home and \$1,012 a year thereafter.
