- d) Will the PIP rural loading continue to be determined by the Rural, Remote and Metropolitan Areas (RRMA) classification?
 - i. If not, which classification system will be used?
- e) Has the Minister for Health consulted the Rural Doctors Association of Australia (RDAA) in deciding upon the amount of the increase?
 - i. If so, what was the nature of the consultation?
 - ii. If so, what issues were raised during the consultation?
 - iii. If so, what was the response of the RDAA?
- f) Which other stakeholders were consulted in deciding upon the amount of the increase?
