Senator Murray Watt asked:

1. How many sole parents with children over 13 will be affected by the changes to the rate of FTB-B by state and electorate?

2. How many sole parents whose youngest child is aged 17-19 will lose FTB-B entirely by state and electorate?

Answer:

- 1. It is estimated that about 114,000 single parent families with a youngest child aged 13 to 16 will receive the reduced \$1,000 rate of FTB Part B from 1 July 2017.
- 2. It is estimated that about 42,000 single parent families with a youngest child aged 17 to 18 will no longer be eligible for FTB Part B from 1 July 2017.

*To provide this level of data at a state and electorate level would require a significant diversion of resources.
