Senator XENOPHON asked:

Senator XENOPHON: This is my second-last question; I will be very quick. On notice, can you tell me how many complaints have been made to the petrol commissioner in the last 12 months, how many have been investigated and what were the outcomes of those investigations?

Answer:

During the period 1 January 2012 to 31 December 2012, there were 1587 identified contacts in relation to fuel. This includes contacts about petrol, LPG, and diesel. The table below provides a breakdown of contacts during the 12 month period.
