The ATO does not account for hospitality and entertainment expenses separately. Official hospitality covers all hospitality and entertainment expenses incurred by the ATO.

ATO hospitality and entertainment includes gifts for external speakers and catering for visiting international tax officials as part of the ATO's commitment to international collaboration and continuing best practice in tax administration.

The ATO reduces the costs of international visits as much as possible by running multilateral events that many countries from the region can attend. The number of requests for visits to the ATO are considerably higher than those that the ATO agrees to each year.
